Submission work will be retained till the declaration of the result and returned to the Candidate by the Department thereafter. If no claim is made within two months of the declaration of the result, the submission will be destroyed.

Note:

- (a) Candidate should pass in theory as well as in practical paper separately.
- (b) There should be minimum 08 hours for the regular study including two hours for sketching.
- (c) Three demonstrations should be arranged by the subject expert during the session for each practical paper.
- (d) The Department should also arrange for an Educational tour to Ancient Art centers like Ajanta, Ellora, Elephanta, Khujraho, Mahabalipuram etc. once a year.
- (e) Practical examination will be conducted at the centers and the practical work will be examined external examiner. The examiner will examine the answer books in consultation with and internal examiner who is the subject teacher of the Department of Drawing and Painting. University may centralize the practical examinations at few well equipped Departments to hold examination economically.
